COURSE PURPOSE: Learn to use your camera and spark your creativity. Through inclass demonstrations and shooting assignments we will explore the mechanics of the digital camera - exposure control, composition, aesthetics and use of light in photography. The purpose of this class is to develop a visual vocabulary with the intention of establishing a strong point of view within each student's imagery. The course will provide an introduction to black & white as well as digital imaging techniques using Adobe Lightroom3.

CRITIQUES: Each project will be critiqued in a group setting. The rigor of participation, production, research and involvement will be assessed for the grade. Plan ahead late work will not be accepted. All photo projects must be completed to receive a passing grade in the class. IF YOU DO NOT ATTENED THE FINAL PHOTO CRIT and/or WRITTEN FINAL YOU WILL GET AN "F" IN THE CLASS.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES/ REQUIREMENTS:

Participation in all critiques

Completion of all projects and technical exercises

Responsible use of equipment and lab

Responsible for learning Lightroom and terms learned in class

Must know their student login and password

Must furnish their own digital camera and supplies

ASSIGNMENTS AND TESTS:

There will be 7 photo assignments that will focus on the below subjects. Each photo assignment will consist of a portfolio of 5 images and PDF contact sheets. The quizzes/midterm/final will focus on terms and technical information learned in class. There also will be written gallery assignment.

- 1. Techie Nerds (Controlling f-stops & Shutter Speeds)
- 2. Theme and Variations
- 3. Composition (rule of thirds- Texture, Light & Pattern)
- 4. Environmental Portrait (What the Heck is Going On?)
- 5. Portrait (head, 1/4, 1/2)
- 6. Landscape (special relationships, not greenery)
- 7. Spill Your Guts (Self Portrait)

For all photo assignments shoot 100 images with proper exposure and focus. Please do not include snapshots or other images that do not pertain to the assignment. Meet with instructor to choose 10 images to fully edit (you may need to re-shoot to clarify your photographic ideas- time management is key). Edit 10 images and turn in the best 4 images with PDF contact sheet on server "drop box".

GRADING:

Grading will be based on individual progress, which will be determined by:

- 1.) Quality of work (30%)
- 2.) All assignments on time (30%)
- 3.) Participation in Critiques and Class Discussions (20%)
- 4.) Test (20%)

ATTENDANCE AND PARTICIPATION:

Most classes will alternate between lecture/critique and lab time. It's important to attend every class to avoid missing important information. It is up to you to get missed information from other students in the class, lectures will not be repeated. It is best to get the email addresses from 2 or 3 of your fellow students. If you are absent contact them about what you missed. I will not repeat lectures via email either. There will be some lab time during class but to complete all the assignments on time you will have to make arrangements outside of class time to work in the lab.

- * During class/lab time no checking email, surfing the web or texting
